### Church Capital Improvements Needed

The time has come to replace the roof of our church. The current plastic terracotta shingles are at the end of their life and we'll be very lucky if we get through the winter without any leaks. On display in the

Hellenic Center Hallway are several roofing samples. Our choices are not limited to these - they are just a starting point. Preliminary cost estimates to replace the roof range from approximately \$10,000 for standard asphalt shingles to \$25,000 for the standing seam metal roofina. Over next the few months we should work

together to gather all of the information necessary to make an informed decision and to raise the funds needed to bring this project to fruition. George Lakatzis, president of the Planning & Finance com-

mittee has begun the fundraising for this project. Please consider making a pledge to donate to this fundraising effort. More project details will follow as they become available.
